Dream Act of 2017 Announced This Week

AILA has issued a <u>press statement</u> and <u>Quicktake video</u> supporting Senators Lindsay Graham (R-SC) and Dick Durbin's (D-IL) Dream Act of 2017, which was introduced earlier today.

Encourage Congress to support this bill and protect Dreamers by taking action: Take Action: Urge Congress to Protect Dreamers and Support the Dream Act of 2017
Senators Lindsey Graham (R-SC) and Dick Durbin (D-IL) introduced the Dream Act of 2017, a bipartisan bill that would provide young people who were brought to the country as children and grew up in the U.S., commonly known as Dreamers, the chance to apply for lawful permanent residence, provided they meet certain requirements. AILA supports the

Dream Act and calls on Congress both to pass the bill and to urge the Administration to continue the DACA program until a more permanent solution is enacted. Tell your member of Congress to defend Dreamers!

The Council aims to demystify the process of challenging denials of business-related petitions in federal court.
